A mosaic, at Madrid's National Archaeological Museum, gives us a look at a Roman-style game. Two gladiators are fighting. One is a *retiarius* (or, net-fighter) whose name is Kalendio. He is fighting a *secutor* named Astyanax.

<u>Life in ancient Rome</u> was hard. Fathers were often separated from their families, defending the Empire's farflung borders. <u>Mothers</u> had lots of <u>children</u>, (the empress Faustina had thirteen), but many babies died. People lived in the city, but wealthy folks had beautiful 0 in the country.

To <u>distract citizens</u> from the daily grind, and to protect their own <u>base of power</u>, the Emperor and other wealthy families hosted (and advertised) games. And what games they were! (The videos in this paragraph provide a history of the <u>Roman games</u> and an understanding of how wild animals were used in the <u>gladiatorial arenas</u>.)

In the Colosseum, Rome's citizens were <u>safely seated</u>, separated by class distinctions. Sometimes they watched men fight other men. These <u>gladiators</u>, as they were called, were Rome's equivalent of movie stars - except that gladiators were members of the lowest class.

Sometimes <u>gladiators fought</u> wild animals <u>instead</u> of each other. Sometimes animals killed other animals. The arena floor was always covered with sand, to absorb all the blood.

At <u>the Circus Maximus</u>, where chariot races and other fanciful activities fascinated the crowd, <u>seating</u> by class distinction was also part of Roman life. Even <u>today's ruins</u> tell a story: Where were the crowds? Where was the Emperor?

In today's world, we can also participate in a Roman game, albeit virtually. The BBC has created an <u>online</u> Gladiator Battle, allowing us to dress a gladiator, select his weapon and have him fight for his freedom.

Near the end of his disastrous rule, the <u>Emperor Commodus</u> was in the arena, a "gladiator," <u>dressed</u> as *Hercules Venator* (Hercules, the Hunter). It was the final mockery.
