And Rannulph Junah isn't just a golfer from Savannah, Georgia. He is a fictionalized version of Arjuna, the mortal whom Bhagavan assists in the Hindu scriptural epic, the *Bhagavad-Gita*.

The 1931 golf match at the <u>Links at Krewe Island</u> between the fictional Junah and two of golf's greatest legends, <u>Bobby Jones</u> and <u>Walter Hagen</u>, never happened, of course. But the backdrop of *The Legend of Bagger Vance* is very real.

A sensational golf match would have provided folks with a much-needed diversion from the daily grind of Depression-wracked America.
