At first Jack Lewis did not have a romantic interest in Joy. She was married, had two children, and lived in America. But when Joy's husband wanted a divorce, so he could marry another woman, Joy returned to Britain permanently. Thereafter, her friendship with Jack <u>deepened</u>.

As a favor to his friend, Jack married Joy in a civil ceremony so she could remain in England. Almost simultaneously, Joy learned the worst possible news: She had terminal cancer. It was 1956, the year the last of the *Narnian* books was published.

Jack's relationship with Joy continued to thrive. Sick, nearly unto death, Joy married Jack again in a Christian ceremony. The wedding took place in December 1956, at her bedside in Wingfield Hospital.

Although doctors had predicted Joy's illness would soon end her life, she experienced a remarkable remission throughout 1957. She moved into <u>The Kilns</u> and, by the summer of 1958, was well enough to take a ten-day trip to one of Jack's favorite places in the world. The <u>Old Inn at Crawfordsburn</u> in County Down, where Jack had wonderful memories from his youth, now became a place he shared with his wife.

Life at home for Jack and Joy was precious, and they drew closer during long hours spent in their <u>drawing room</u> and <u>sitting room</u>. But their time was short-lived, despite Joy's unexpected remission. By the spring of 1960, her cancer returned. She did not have much time left.


