Sixteenth-century France was at war with herself. The battle was over religion.

Henri IV, before he was king, was leader of the Huguenots (another name for French Protestants). But when Henri of Navarre (as he was called before he took the throne of France) realized he could only rule the country if he renounced his faith, the future king became a Catholic. As <u>Henri</u> reportedly said, "Paris was worth a Mass."

To make sure his former co-religionists could worship freely, however, Henri IV <u>signed</u> the <u>Edict of Nantes</u>. Although that proclamation permitted religious tolerance, the plight of Huguenots worsened after the king was assassinated. Their stronghold, the Atlantic port city of <u>La Rochelle</u>, was attacked by Louis XIII's troops.

Some of those <u>troops</u> were called <u>Musketeers</u> (later made even-more famous by Alexander Dumas in his book, *The Three Musketeers*).
