On the way to his new position, Abraham Lincoln (<u>like</u> Barack Obama, 138 years later) took a train ride from Philadelphia to Washington, D.C. Ahead of <u>the man from Illinois</u> was a seemingly impossible job. A greatly divided country was inching closer to civil war.

At the capitol, Lincoln <u>delivered</u> his <u>first</u> Inaugural Address. He <u>warned</u> the country:

We are not enemies but friends -We must not be enemies.

His words, of course, went unheeded.

In April of 1861, the month following his speech, the American Civil War began.
