<u>People were awakened</u> by <u>the fire</u>. Many <u>left their homes</u> with shawls and blankets around them. One of the few close-up illustrations depicts <u>a family in anguish</u>.

 $\underline{\text{People fleeing death}} \text{ spent the night among the cemetery dead -} \underline{\text{at Potter's Field}}, \text{ near Lincoln Park - close to the Lake Michigan shore}.$

The Chicago Tribune was burned out of its building. Citizens, in a panic, tried to flee over the Randolph Street Bridge.

There was a heartbreaking loss of life as entire families were <u>unable to escape</u>. A hundred thousand people who had enjoyed an unseasonably warm and beautiful Sunday were homeless by Sunday night.

<u>Fleeing people</u> thought they'd be safe <u>in Lake Michigan</u>. They weren't. Some never came out of the water. James H. Goodsell, an eyewitness, describes the scene (<u>on page 29</u>) in his <u>1871 book</u>, *History of the Great Chicago Fire*:

The intense heat from the <u>burning buildings</u>, even the flames from them, <u>reached the water</u>, and even stretched out over it, and the flying men, women, and children, <u>rushed into the lake</u> till nothing but their heads appeared above the <u>surface of the waters</u>; but <u>the fiery fiend</u> was not satisfied. The hair was burned off the heads of many, while some never came out of the water alive. Many who stayed on the shore, where the space between the fire and water was a little wider, had the clothes burned from off their backs.

In addition to damaged lives, Chicagoans had to contend with a <u>destroyed city</u>. Many of the <u>wooden buildings</u> were gone or had to be demolished.

Overwhelmed, the people could barely fathom their losses. (Eighty-seven years later, they would endure another disastrous fire—at Our Lady of the Angels School—in which 92 children and three nuns died.)

Why Didn't Lake Michigan Provide Chicagoans Safety from the Great Fire?

Pictures, drawings and eyewitness reports regarding the Great Fire, as it occurred in parts of Chicago and Peshtigo, reveal that the waters of Lake Michigan and the Peshtigo River did not provide safety for everyone who was fleeing the flames.

What does the report from eyewitness, James Goodsell, tell us about fire refugees who expected safety when they reached the waters of Lake Michigan?

Were those expectations reasonable? Why, or why not?
