Spring was in full bloom that Monday morning. Before 7 a.m., on the 16th of April, 2007, all seemed well at Virginia Tech's campus in <u>Blacksburg</u>, <u>Virginia</u>.

<u>Emily Jane Hilscher</u> had just returned to her dorm when, shortly after 7 a.m., an intruder entered. Soon thereafter, she was the first victim of America's second-worst massacre perpetrated by a single individual. (The worst occurred in 1927, when a lone dynamite-planter killed one-quarter of the children in a Michigan town during the Bath Consolidated School massacre.)

Before the V-Tech horror was over, two people were fatally shot at <u>West Ambler Johnston residence hall</u> while thirty other students and faculty were gunned down at <u>Norris Hall</u>. Seventeen more were wounded, some as they tried to flee.

The <u>story of the Virginia Tech massacre</u>, and the support of VT's community <u>for each other</u> in its aftermath, is well told on the <u>Hokies' memorial web site</u>. This is a different story. It celebrates the lives of those who were lost with words written by <u>McMullen County High School</u> students.
