Slaves were <u>initially</u> shipped from Africa to Portugal, and Portugese possessions, in the 15th century.

By the time America's first slaves were brought to the English colony at Jamestown, <u>in 1619</u>, slavery had become <u>big business</u>. Initially, however, those African captives were really more like indentured <u>servants</u> instead of slaves.

As the American colonies tried to wrest *their* freedom from Great Britain, plantation owners in the South <u>bought</u> <u>and sold</u> Africans. A modern drawing by Jacob Lawrence, depicting an event from 1776, illustrates the reality of slavery during the American Revolutionary War.

The title of the work? "The cruelty of the planters toward the slaves drove the slaves to revolt, 1776."






