Lt. Robinson was not amused when a Texas bus driver told him to give up his seat.

It was the 6th of July, 1944 - two days after war-weary Americans had celebrated their Declaration of Independence. That document - the foundation of America - asserts that "all men are created equal."

Robinson wasn't feeling very "equal" on that hot July day, however. Why should he move to the rear of the bus? Because a white bus driver told him to do it?

<u>Jack Roosevelt Robinson</u> - known as "Jackie Robinson" - refused to move. By the time the bus reached the station, a white woman told the Army officer she planned to file charges against him.

It wasn't the first time that a white female had <u>badgered Robinson about his race</u>. To remember the first time it happened, however, the Lt. had to go back *many* years.
