Declaration of Independence - July 4, 1776

It was 1775. <u>George III</u> ruler of Great Britain, viewed the thirteen American <u>colonies</u> as "his." Heavy taxes, paid by the colonials, filled the king's treasury.

Life was good - for some people. For others, like <u>Thomas Paine</u>:

These are the times that try men's souls

The American Crisis

What was trying "men's souls" was British rule. The time had come for America to be free.

But cutting the ties that bound <u>thirteen colonies</u> to England would not happen without a revolt. No one ever gives up a treasure without a fight. Especially not a king.

Many colonists, however, believed their cause was supported by a power much higher and greater than King George. Those beliefs helped to fan the flames of revolutionary fervor.


