

African-American Escapees Approach Union Lines



During America's Civil War, slaves would sometimes approach Union lines for help. This illustration, by Edward Forbes (1839-1895), depicts such an event which took place in Virginia during 1863.

Now part of the Morgan Collection of Civil War Drawings, at the Library of Congress, the <u>image bears this description</u>:

African American refugees coming into the Union lines near Culpeper Court House, Va.
