Imperial Valley California - Ditch Bank Housing





Among the types of homes which Dorothea Lange photographed, during the 1930s, were ditch-bank houses. Mexican migratory farm workers lived in places like this in California's Imperial Valley.

When Dorothea Lange took this picture, in March of 1937, she was working for the federal government's Resettlement Administration (later known as the Farm Security Administration). The Library of Congress, which maintains the original negative, provides this <u>image description</u>:
