



The gardens were waterproof but they had water problems. The water was raised from 75 feet of water to 300 feet. German archaeologist <u>Robert Koldewey</u> did uncover unusual chambers that may have been used to pump a water chain.

The Hanging Gardens of Babylon was destroyed by an earthquake in the 2nd century BC. Even though the gardens were destroyed they are still remembered to this day.
